

THE TIMES OF THE NEW MOON מולדות

The *Molads* are announced by the *Gabai* at the time of the Blessing of the New Month, which takes place on the *Shabbos* before *Rosh Chodesh* (with the exception of the month of *Tishrei* whose *Molad* is not announced). The time for the *Molad* of each month is traditionally expressed in days, minutes, and *Chalokim* after the hour. (A *Cheilek*, the smallest traditional measurement of the time, is $1/1080$ of an hour, or $1/18$ of a minute, which amounts to a little more than three seconds.) Thus, the traditional way of announcing the *Molad* for *MarCheshvan* would be to announce: "The *Molad* for *MarCheshvan* will be Wednesday afternoon 11 minutes and 12 *chalakim* after 12."
